As it is an affiliated college, it follows the Curriculum Prescribed by the a affiliating University, however the members of the faculty have freedom to express their views and opinions about the design of the syllabus by conducting workshops, seminars and symposia. The affiliating university prescribed compulsory non-core subjects like computer fundamentals, Indian constitution and Environmental studies for all UG students as per the directions of Inter University Board.
