PART - A

The plan of action chalked out by the IQAC in the beginning of the year towards quality enhancement and the outcome achieved by the end of the year.

The IQAC met in the first week after the reopening of the college and decided to initiate measures to achieve quality in all aspects of the college. The college received a grant of rupees 45 lakhs from the Government of Karnataka for the construction of class rooms and laboratories. The construction work was entrusted to the local public works department. A master plan was prepared by the local MLA Dr. M.C. Sudhakar in consultation with the architects of the Government of Karnataka under PWD. The IQAC decided to improve the results of the college in the university examination by means of qualitative and innovative methods of teaching to the best satisfactory of the stake-holders of the college. It was also decided to engage extra classes for below average students. A sincere effort would be made to equip laboratories which are bifurcated from the parent college.

Out come of the Plan :

Correspondence was initiated regarding the construction work of the college with the concerned authorities. There is a considerable improvement in the results of the college as a result of the sincere efforts made by the teaching faculty in both the semesters of the Current academic year.

The academic and administrative activities of the college for the current academic year went on smoothly without any obstacles.
