The Aims of NCC :

- **To develop** character, comradeship, discipline, leadership, secular outlook, spirit of adventure, sportsmanship and ideals of selfless service among the youth of the country.
- **To create** a human resource of organized, trained and motivated youth, to provide leadership in all walks of life and always be available for the service of the nation.
- **To provide** a suitable environment to motivate the youth to take up a career in the Armed Forces.
- **Brief History of NCC:** NCC was conceived in the year 1917 when India Defence Act was promulgated with an object of making up the shortfalls in the Armed Forces by raising the University Corps. In 1920, with the passage of India Territorial Act, University Corps was replaced by University Training Corps. In 1942, this Corps was rechristened as the University Officers Training Corps. In 1946, a committee under Pandit H N Kunzru was set up at the behest of Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru to formulate the establishment of an organisation capable of training and motivating the youth of the country to become the best citizens and leaders in all walks of life. Accordingly, the National Cadet Corps came into being on July 16,

1948 with the promulgation of the **NCC Act XXXI of 1948**. The NCC was and now, placed under the **Ministry of Defence**, Government of India.

NCC eligibility criteria and certificate exam

Eligibility criteria:

- Must be a citizen of India.
- Age limit for senior division -for both boys and girls is 19-25.
- One should be physically fit.

Certificate exam:

A cadet must have attended a minimum of 75% of the total training parade and must have attended minimum one camp in order to take up any certificate exam in NCC. Certificates will be awarded only if NCC cadets clear both practical and theory exam.

There are three different certificate exams; 'C' certificate has the highest value.

1. 'A' certificate: It is awarded to junior (school) cadets on completion of second year of training.
2. 'B' certificate: This is awarded to senior (PU/Degree) cadets on completion of second year of training.
3. 'C' certificate: This is awarded to senior (Degree) cadets on completion of third year of training. B certificate is a prerequisite.

Benefits of NCC certificate

1. NCC cadets have a special quota which is very useful in case of final selection to join the armed forces.
2. Under the regime of exchange programme, there are a few selected students who get an opportunity to visit other countries and learn various facets of life and living which are practised in other nations and exchange experiences with cadets who happen to come to India from foreign lands

3. NCC cadets get preference over the other in the CRF and BSF.
4. Several central and state Government organisations who give special preference to NCC cadets.

NCC at GFGC Devanahalli

NCC at GFGC started in 2018, it is affiliated to 5 KAR Bn NCC, Chikkaballapura , Bangalore 'B' Group, Karnataka and Goa Directorate. NCC Cadets are selected by the officers from the unit, 5 KAR Bn NCC, by conducting physical fitness test. Parades is conducted for four hours on every Saturday to the enrolled cadets, without disturbing the regular course of study of the students. Practical classes and theory classes are conducted and various activities like drill, weapon training and theory classes on military subjects are conducted during the parade days by the Associate NCC Officer, LT Dr Krishna Murthy N P and Parade Instructor.
