ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION

Candidates who have completed Two year Pre – University course of Karnataka State or its equivalent thereto shall be eligible for admission to these programs.

DURATION OF THE COURSE

The course of study is three (03) years of six Semesters. A candidate shall complete his/her degree within six (06) academic years from the date of his/ her admission to the first semester.

MEDIUM OF INSTRUCTION

The medium of instruction shall be in English & kannada for B.com and B.A. For BBA medium of instruction is only English. However, a candidate will be permitted to write the examination either in English or in Kannada.

ATTENDANCE

- a. For the purpose of calculating attendance, each semester shall be taken as a Unit.
- b. A student shall be considered to have satisfied the requirement of attendance for the semester, if he/she has attended not less than 75% in aggregate of the number of working periods in each of the subjects compulsorily.
- c. Students should be regular to classes and in case they have missed classes they should submit a letter to the concerned class teacher/ Principal. Submit a medical certificate if it is for health issues.
- d. Students should actively participate in all co-curricular and extra-curricular activities.

COLLEGE INFRASTRUCTURE

The building has sufficient class rooms with required furniture. There are separate toilet blocks for boys

and girls. Drinking water facility is available. The College has a good library with computer facilities for the students. The library has **7708** books on subjects related to the courses taught, in addition to literary volumes, ready references. The college subscribes **13** magazines and journals. The library has a reference section in which students can put their new ideas in to perspective and enhance their knowledge.

University level prize in boxing and weight lifting and athletics.

- **Students Counseling Cell:** The cell has experienced student counsellors
- **Active Placement Cell:** The college placement cell is very active in creating employability among the students. In association with UNNATTI Foundation organizes free 90 hours employability skill training for the final year B.COM & BA students and also the college organizes campus interviews which benefit the students to get placed in reputed companies.

SCHEME OF EXAMINATION

- There shall be a university examination at the end of each semester. The maximum marks for the university examination in each paper shall be 70.
- Of the 30 marks of Internal Assessment, 20 marks shall be based on Two tests. Each test shall be of at least 01 hour duration to be held during the semester. The average of two tests shall be taken as the internal assessment marks. The remaining 10 marks of the Internal

Assessment shall be based on Attendance and Skill Development Record of 05 marks each.

- The marks based on attendance shall be awarded as given below:

- 75% to 80% = 02 marks.
- 81% to 85% = 03 marks.
- 86% to 90% = 04 marks.
- 91% to 100% = 05 marks.

MINIMUM FOR A PASS

Candidates who have obtained a minimum of 35% marks in university examination (i.e. 25 marks out of 70 marks of theory examination) and 40% in aggregate (i.e., total of university examination and internal assessment marks) in each subject shall be eligible for a pass or exemption in that subject.

CLASSIFICATION OF SUCCESSFUL CANDIDATES

- Class shall be declared on the basis of the aggregate marks obtained by the candidates in this degree course (excluding languages (part I) and non- core subjects (Part III)) as a whole. However, only those candidates who have passed each semester university examination in the first attempt only shall be eligible for award of ranks. The first ten ranks only shall be notified
- The results of the First to Sixth semester degree examination shall be declared and classified separately as follows:
 - First Class:** Those who obtain 60% and above of the total marks of parts I, II and III.
 - Second Class:** Those who obtain 50% and above but less than 60% of total marks of parts I, II and III.
 - Pass Class:** Rest of the successful candidates who secure 40% and above but less than 50% of marks in part I, II and III.
